Hyperspacing the verb

- Bilateral research project between Austria and Slovenia funded by the Austrian National Science Agency (FWF).
- Topic: Lexical level properties of Slovenian and Bosnian / Croatian / Montenegrin / Serbian (BCMS) verbs.
- Domains: Empirical and theoretical semantics, syntax, morphology and phonology.
- Researchers: Boban Arsenijević, Marko Simonović, Stefan Milosavljević (University of Graz) and Lanko Marušič, Rok Žaucer and Petra Mišmaš (University of Nova Gorica).

WeSoSlav

- One of the central deliverables of the project.
- A database of
 - 8300 verbs from the two languages
 - annotated for a range of lexical level properties
 - semantic (e.g. aspect),
 - syntactic (e.g. case assigned to arguments),
 - morphological (e.g. suffixes) and
 - phonological (e.g. prosodic shape).
- Basis for a broad range of different research questions, matching a variety of datasets and tasks of different levels and granularities.
- Saves time for the preparation of datasets, gives structure and sets a frame.

Students

- Slavic studies.
- Bachelor, but also Master level.
- 3 levels of proficiency:
 - learners,
 - monolingual speakers,
 - heritage speakers.
- Very little to no background in scientific / linguistic methodology, or in technical competences (even for the basic software or corpus searches).

Models of usage

- Database development and annotation:
 - students pursue the entire procedure of annotation of new properties on parts of the database
 - Example: thematic roles.
- Data analysis:
 - students formulate and statistically test hypotheses about the interactions of the annotated properties
 - Example: correlations between perfectivity and assignment of accusative.
- Corpus research based on the database:
 - students search corpora and gather data for classes of verbs defined by an annotated property
 - Example: nominalizations derived from verbs with prosodic prominence on the inflection, on the theme vowel, on the root or on the prefix.

Teaching method

- Introduce the theoretical background in parallel with the methodological basics, and then in several steps identify problems and let the students cope with them with as little intervention as manageable:
- Formulate a research question,2a. leading to the first problem: how can we best use WeSoSlav to address it?
- Define a set of tasks to accomplish 2a, 3a. leading to a set of methodological and technical problems (emerging on the way): how to successfully accomplish them?
- Discuss the outcome and draw theoretical conclusions;

 4a. the outcomes are rarely fully congruent, unambiguous and decisive, leading to the final set of problems: how to interpret the results?

Aims

- Get a real experience of pursuing research in the field of study.
- Acquire in a heuristic way methodological skills and competences necessary for linguistic research.
- Acquire technical skills and competences necessary for linguistic research.
- Gain descriptive and theoretical knowledge in the language of study.
- Advance problem-solving capacities.
- Advance interpretive and logical skills.
