
Main Goals of CLARIN

 - Supporting community







Supporting five phases of e-Humanities projects




Referencing resources

- Resources referenced via persistent identifiers (PIDs)
- PIDs resolve to a repository/archive
- If repository moves, resolvers change
- No requirement for "last visited" or similar

Why are standards important for CLARIN?

- The project partners and centers is heterogeneous in both topics and organizational structure
- The resources available are heterogeneous regarding topics, technical formats, and copyright
- Standards may help to establish interchange

Standards and CLARIN

- In CLARIN, everyone agrees that the use of standards is desirable to interoperate with each other
- But: many researchers still lack knowledge to use 'the right standards'
- Even if information about a specific standard is available, information about its relations to other standards is not
