

Adjectivization of Participles in Lithuanian

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Lithuanian participles

- ***Valgantis*** vaikas – *eating child,*
- ***nupirktas*** maistas – *bought food,*
- ***skaitomi*** žodžiai – *words that are being read.*

Ambivalent nature of participles

- Participles have properties of **verbs** and **adjectives** (DLKG 2005: 354).
- They have the **meaning of verb, categories of voice and tense, verbal arguments** (*vakar nupirkta maistas – food that has been bought yesterday, nupirkęs maistas – (someone who) has bought food*).
- They can be **inflected like adjectives, have degrees, pronominal forms and attributive, predicative functions.**

Adjectivization

- Participles can **lose verbal properties**.
- They become **adjectivized**:
- *įprastas* (*usual*; verb *įprasti* – *to get used to*),
- *nepakartojamas* (*unforgettable*; verb *nepakartoti* – *not to repeat*);
- *nevykęs* (*unsuccessful*; verb *nevykti* – *not to happen*);
- *užimtas žmogus* (*busy person*; verb *užimti* – *to occupy*).

The aim of the thesis

- Sometimes it is difficult to differentiate **between adjectivized and simple participles**.
- **The aim of this thesis** is to find criteria to differentiate between adjectives and participles that have similar function.

Pilot study

Material:

- 160 frequent verbs;
- 43 adjectives with forms of participles.

Criteria to identify adjectivized participles

- Semantic;
- Grammatical;
- Derivational;
- Statistical.

Future work

- To use more statistical information for automatic analysis.
- To analyze more words, to classify participles by the degree of adjectivization.
- One of the possible results: word lists in which participles would be classified by the degree of adjectivization.
