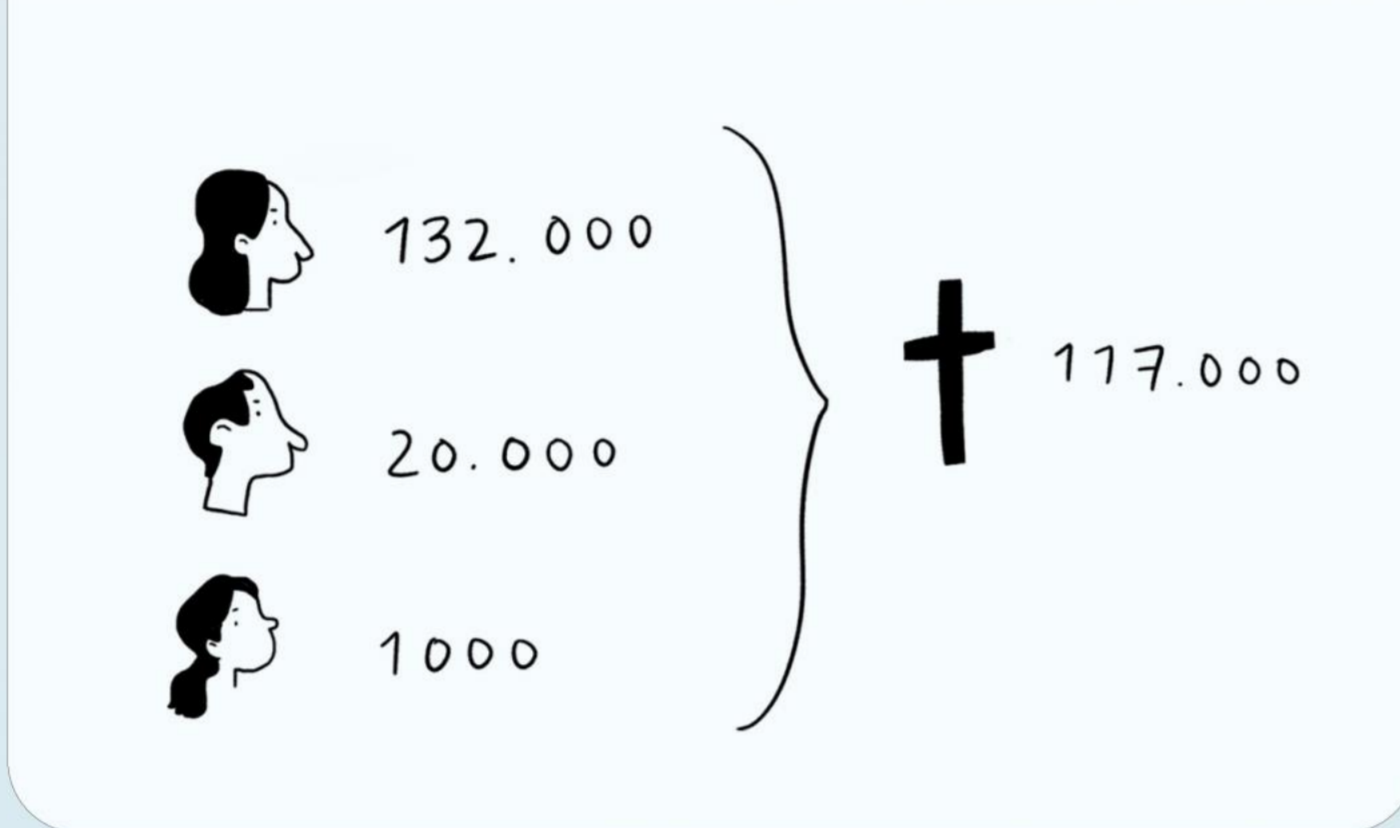
1939

1939 - 1945



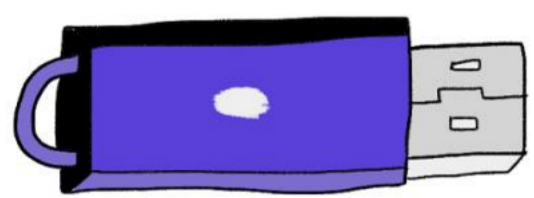

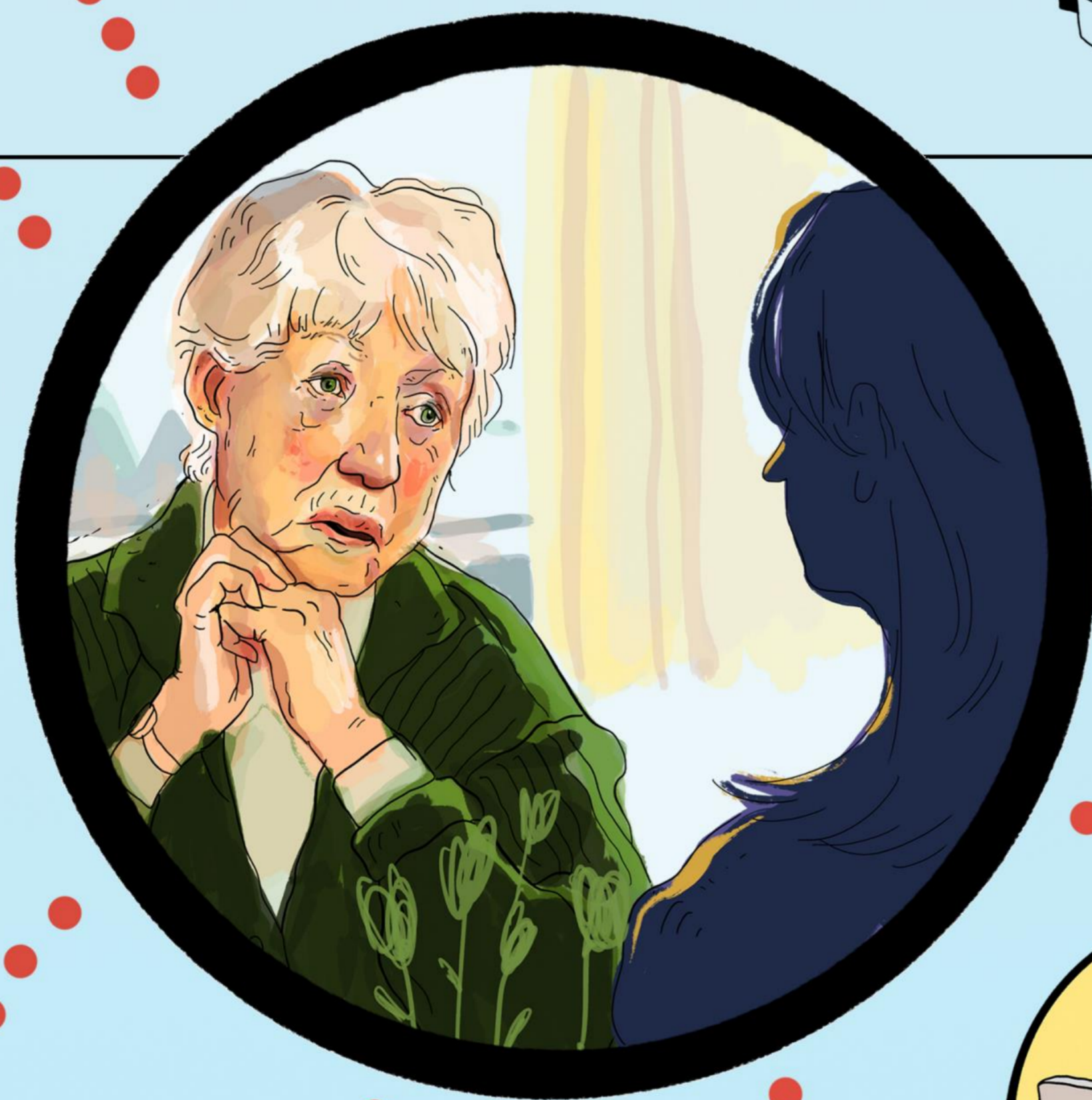


As this group of contemporary witnesses around the world grew older and gradually passed away, the need was felt in several countries to preserve their personal stories through oral history interviews.
