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- To create a community or network with a certain level of confidence about quality assurance in some respects
- To promote standards-conformance to allow distributed services to be built
- To attract and keep users by giving them some confidence about quality assurance

Why assess?





- To spread good practice,
- To make clear open transparent statements about standards
- To support new entrants,
- To provide demonstrable badges of quality which can be shown to various stakeholders
