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- There are national and institutional **policies** for DOIs in terms of:
 - Eligibility (Who can have one, for what resources?)
 - Procedures for allocation (Via which authority? How?)
 - Syntax of DOI naming (How much freedom?)
 - Payment (Who pays, how much?)(e.g. resources currently have to be in the Bodleian Library's institutional repository to be allocated a DOI by the University of Oxford, and the repository only collects outputs from Oxford academics)
- Decisions to be made about **granularity** of assignment (different requirements for citation and for automatic processing by language processing tools?)
- Resources in multiple repositories - lots of **copies**, lots of DOIs?
- **Bulk** assignment – what do you do if you have 4000 to register?
- But it's not all negative – there is much to gain to monitor citation and usage, and to be able to work with resources not curated by CLARIN

Format of DOIs

- Format : **XX.XXXX/bodleianNNNN.V?file=FFFF** ¹
 - **X** = DOI prefix (10.5287)
 - **N** = Accession code for the data package
 - **V** = Version number for the data package (N)
 - **F** = Filename (optional)
 - Sample DOI: 10.5287/bodleianfdk5.3
 - 10.5287/bodleianfdk5.3/Readme

- DOIs are defined to be case-insensitive

- Version number can be omitted
